Indian company to supply gas pipes

DHAKA, JAN 9: To transport additional gas, which would be produced by Bibiyan and Jalalabad gas fields and potential new gas field of Sunetra, Gas Iransmission Company Ltd (GTCL), a subsidiary of Petrobargla, on Sunday signed a contract with Mann Industries Ltd, an Indian compatny, for procuring of pipes.

Aiming to tap new gas from these three fields, the ECNEC approved a Tk. 1,600-crore project to instal a 36-inch 137 km gas transmission line on November 15 to supply more gas to Dhaka and the western zone.

"This is the first of its kind in the country's gas sector, as we do not have 36-inch line," Mohammad Mijbhauddin, secretary in the energy and mineral resources division, said. He said



it is optimistic but the aim is to falfil it with courage and enthusiasm.


To mark of the occasion, the ministry organised a media briefing at Ruposhi Bangla hotel.

Mohammad Yunus, secretary of the GTCL, and Sanjib Day, representative of the Mann group, have signed the agreement on behalf of their respective organisations.

Abul Maal Abdul Muhith, finance minister, Dr Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury, adviser to the Prime Minister, Enamul Haq, state minister for power, energy and mineral resources, Subid Ali Bhunyan, chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on power, energy and mineral resources. Sayed Yusuf Hossain, chairman of Bangladesh Energy Regulatory Commission, Dr Hossain Monsut, chairman of Petrobangla, Aminul Islam, managing director of GTCL, and top officials of Petrobangla and the energy ministry were present on the occasion.

"We are still in a crisis. But if we compare the present with the past, we can see for ourselves the task performed by officials in the ast three years." Muhith said. He said the energy sector will be stahe by the end of 2013.

"The government is a system. What the government does today, will produce results tomorrow. We hope that we will be able to provide a comfortable status for the next government," he added.
